# Yara's Mariupol Art Project

captures the resilience of Ukrainians in an exhibit of Pulitzer Prize-winning photographs and a multi-media performance about Russia's full-scale invasion of the city.

An exhibit of photographs documenting the siege of Mariupol by acclaimed Pulitzer Prize winners Evgeniy Maloletka and Mstyslav Chernov envelops a stage production by Yara Arts Group. The result is the multi-media event, *Mariupol*, featuring a powerful photography exhibit and a compelling performance piece titled *Mariupol: Diary of War and the Tree of Life*. To create the latter, Virlana Tkacz interwove four diaries from Mariupol collected by Daria Kolomiec in her "Diary of War" podcast together with songs, video and poetry by Serhiy Zhadan, Ukraine's best-known poet.

Presented by Howl Arts & Yara Arts Group, the *Mariupol Exhibit* runs March 7 to 24, 2024, Wed--Sundays 1-5 PM, at Howl 6 East 1st Street in Manhattan.

The performance piece, *Mariupol: Diarry of War and the Tree of Life*, plays in the same space on March 15-17, & 22-24

at 6 PM.


The *Mariupol Exhibition* photographs are by **Evgeniy Maloletka** and **Mstyslav Chernov**, the only Ukrainian journalists with international connections reporting from the besieged city. Their work earned them the 2023 Pulitzer Prize for public service. Evgeniy Maloletka received a second Pulitzer for breaking news photography and the prestigious Press Photo of the Year Award. Mstyslav Chernov's documentary film, "20 Days in Mariupol," has earned numerous awards, including the British Academy Film Award, and the Oscar for best documentary film

Mariupol: Diary of War and the Tree of Life performance is directed by Virlana Tkacz and features four diaries collected by Daria Kolomiec. The Mariupol diaries are by Yaroslav Semenenko, a member of the Ukrainian National Paralympic swim team; Yevhenia Ivanchenko, a captain in the Mariupol Police; Olena Nikulina, from an old Mariupol family, whose husband defended Azovstal and is currently a Russian captive; and Valeria Mykhailovska, was working in the Czech Republic and decided to return home to Mariupol to rescue her mother.

Virlana interwove the diaries from Mariupol, adding several poems by Serhiy Zhadan, which she translated with **Wanda Phipps**. Yara's **Julian** 


Kytasty created the music and Maksym Lozynskyj designed the sound. Tom Lee designed the production with Waldemart Klyuzko. Yara performers include Hanna Datsko, George Drance, Silvana Gonzalez, Oksana Horban, Susan Hwang, Daria Kolomiec, Diana Kuzminova, Maksym Lozynskyj and Petro Ninovskyi.

# Press on Yara's Mariupol Arts Project

Here is some press on Yara's *Mariupol Art Project* at Howl Happening Gallery this March:

"A multi-media performance recreating the stories of Ukrainians from the city of Mariupol, now destroyed and occupied by Russian forces, during the first months of the full-scale invasion, has a limited run this month in New York City. The heartbreaking accounts, based on real diaries of Ukrainian people, are recreated by Englishspeaking actors, bridging the gap between the awful realities of the war and western audiences.

Mariupol: Diary of War and the Tree of Life, created by Virlana Tkacz, is presented by the Yara Arts Group. The show is accompanied by photos taken by Evgeniy Maloletka and Mstyslav Chernov, Pulitzer Prize winning journalists, whose film, 20 Days in Mariupol received the Oscar as best feature documentary.

#### Press in Ukrainian

До 24 березня у Нью-Йорку триватиме виставка "Маріуполь" мультимедійний проєкт, присвячений тимчасово окупованому місту з нагадуванням для американської публіки про воєнні злочини росіян. Про це Суспільне Культура дізналося з пресрелізу.

Проєкт "Маріуполь" складається з двох частин:

1) виставки фотографій від Євгена

Малолєтки і Мстислава Чернова Фотограф Євген Малолєтка разом із відеожурналістом Мстиславом Черновим та продюсеркою Васи-ЛісоюСтепаненко були єдиними представ-никами міжнародних медіа, які понад два тижні працювали в Маріуполі під російською окупацією.

Команда докумен-тувала руйнування, ро-боту медиків у лікар-нях, жертви серед ци-вільного населення. Найбільший резонанс спричинили кадри, зня-ті 9 березня біля зруйнованого через російські обстріли пологового будинку. Ці та інші матеріали стали основою для фільму "20 днів у Маріуполі", що здобув для України першого "Оскара" в історії.

2) документального теат-рального перформансу Mariupol: Diary of War and the Tree of Life Перформанс створила організація Howl Arts та мистецька група Yara Arts Group. Його сюжет побудовано на чотирьох історіях українців, які на початку вторгнення опинилися в Маріуполі: Ярослав Семененко член паралімпійської збірної України з плавання;, Евгенія Іванченко капітанка поліції Маріуполя;, Олена Нікуліна дружина азовця Максима Нікуліна, який зараз перебуває в російському полоні; Валерія Михайловська, яка на момент 24 лютого 2022 року працювала у Чехії та вирішила повернутися додому в Маріуполь, щоб врятувати матір.

Перформанс поєднує документальні матеріали з проєкту активістки Дар'ї Коломієць Diary of War, поезію, пісні та хорео-

графію. Режисеркою проєкту стала американська мисткиня українського походження Вірляна Ткач. У виставі використали поезію Сергія Жадана в перекладі Вірляни та Ванди Фіпс. Над музикою працював бандурист Джуліан Китастий, декорації створив художник Том Лі, а митець Вальдемар Клюзко розробив візуальну концепцію та графіку.

Виставка "Маріуполь" працюватиме до 24березня, із середи по неділю з 13:00 до 17:00, за адресою Howl 6 East 1st Street на Мангеттені. Виставу Mariupol: Diary of War and the Tree of Life можна буде побачити в цьому ж приміщенні з 22 до 24 березня о 18:00.

#### Yara's Koliada 2023



Last December I visited Kryvorvnia in the Carpathians and had long discussions with our Koliadnyky. We decided to film their answers to questions that I had always wanted to ask them

I asked Pan Ivan Zelenchuk how he first heard about the Koliada. I had heard about how his father kept a notebook with the old words, but had not heard many of the other stories and hadn't seen any of the old photographs.

We decided that this year Yara's Koliada zoom would include these interviews, as well the story of how my own interest in the Koliada arose and changed over the years.

In the zoom, I outlined what is the Hutsul Koliada and how I first put together our bilingual book Still the River Flows: Winter Solstice and Christmas Rituals in a Carpathian Village.

We collected the material for the book during our first visit to Kryvorivnia in 2003 with photographer **Alexander Khantaev** and a lot of help from pani **Lesia Turianska**. This book includes a basic outline and the words and translations I did with **Wanda Phipps** to our favorite winter songs, including the oldest Koliada ever written down.

Mykola Zelenchuk, Ivan's son who worked with us on

many Koliada performances, was asked to tell us about his *trembita*. In New York, he always used one of the pair that old man Tafiychuk had made for us. At home he had a very old *trembita*. He told its story and played it for us.

Next. I visited Mykola Il-yuk's Museum in Verkhovyna and talked to him about his violin. Mykola is a multi-instrumentalist and can play just about anything, even an old shotgun as he proved. Mykola also told me about his father and how he took part in the iconic film Shadows of Forgotten Ancestors.

Many of the best Koliadas are the ones dedicated to young women and the man with a house full of young ladies is **Vasyl Tymchuk**. He has five daughters and is also know as the best *tsymably* player in the Carpathians. He showed us his prowess and

Vasyl's daughters shared with us a new Koliada – one about Russia's war on Ukraine today.

Ostap Kostiuk sent us a video with his wishes for all of us. How appropriate, since each visit by the Koliadnyky ends with their wishes for us in the coming year.
